CLOSING REMARKS



Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson

Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, the leader — "the Rebbe" — of the Lubavitch movement of Chassidic Judaism for forty-four years was a paradoxical man. While he barely set foot outside his neighborhood during his entire leadership, his influence was felt worldwide. While he was considered one of the world's foremost religious scholars, he was also recognized as a brilliant

scholar in mathematics and science. While he appeared to be an Old World leader whose community was somewhat cloistered, he was thoroughly knowledgeable about the modern world and reached out enthusiastically to society at large, to Jew and non-Jew alike, encouraging the pursuit of virtuousness, education, and unity.

Menachem Mendel Schneerson was born on April 18, 1902 (the eleventh day of Nissan, 5662), in Nikolayev, a town in Southern Ukraine. His father, Rabbi Levi Yitzchak Schneerson, was a renowned scholar; his mother, Rebbetzin Chana Schneerson, was an aristocratic woman from a prestigious Rabbinic family. He had two younger brothers, Dovber and Yisroel Aryeh Leib. When Menachem Mendel was five years old, the family moved to Yekaterinoslav, now Dnepropetrovsk, where his father was appointed Chief Rabbi.



From early childhood, Menachem Mendel displayed prodigious mental acuity, leaving school for private tutoring. By the time he reached his bar mitzvah, he was considered a Torah prodigy; and during his teenage years he immersed himself in the intricacies of Torah study. In 1923, he met Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn — then the Lubavitcher Rebbe — who

drew him into his inner circle, giving him various responsibilities. Five years later in Warsaw, he married the Rebbe's second-eldest daughter, Chaya Mushka (1901-1988).

A short while later, the couple moved to Berlin, where Rabbi Menachem Mendel had already begun studying mathematics and science at the University of Berlin. Because of the Nazi rise, the young Rabbi and his wife left Berlin in 1933 for Paris, and he continued his studies at the Sorbonne. Primarily, he immersed himself in prayer and religious study, and was referred to by his father-in-law on various matters including the preparation of Lubavitch publications.

When the Nazis occupied Paris, the couple was forced to escape the city. On June 23, 1941, they arrived by boat in New York where Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneersohn appointed his son-in-law

head of Lubavitch's educational arm, as well as the movement's social-service organization and its publishing house.

In 1950, Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak passed away. Although Rabbi Menachem Mendel was the obvious successor, he was initially reluctant to accpet the mantle of leadership. One year later, he formally assumed the title of Rebbe, explaining to members of the movement that while he would be devoted to his work as a leader, each man and woman was ultimately responsible for his or her own actions, and for his or her own pursuit of G-dliness.

The ensuing forty-four years of the Rebbe's leadership saw Lubavitch grow from a small movement — nearly devastated by the Holocaust — to a worldwide community of more than 200,000 members. The Rebbe, recognizing the unique needs of the current generation and anticipating the societal upheaval of coming decades, began to establish education and outreach centers, offering social service programs and humanitarian aid to all people, regardless of religious affiliation or background. He established a corps of Lubavitch emissaries (shluchim) and sent them out to build Chabad-Lubavitch centers worldwide, to serve the spiritual and material needs of the local communities. Today, there are more than three thousand Chabad-Lubavitch institutions in over seventy countries on six continents. By blending

his intense religious and secular training with deep compassion and insight, the Rebbe quietly became a leader to whom other leaders — those in politics, business and religion — turned for advice. Beginning in 1986, he would personally greet thousands of visitors each Sunday, distributing dollar bills as a momento of their visit with the Rebbe, a testament to being moved by his presence. In the Rebbe's latest talks, he emphasized the imminence of the final Redemption, and asked Jews and non-Jews alike to increase in acts of goodness and kindness as a means of preparing oneself and the world at large for Moshiach.

In 1992, at the age of ninety, the Rebbe suffered a stroke; he passed away two years later on June 12, 1994. Shortly thereafter, a bill was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Congressmen Charles Schumer, John Lewis, Newt Gingrich and Jerry Lewis to bestow on the Rebbe the Congressional Gold Medal. The bill passed both Houses by unanimous consent, honoring the Rebbe for his "outstanding and lasting contributions toward improvements in world education, morality and acts of charity."

This year, as world Jewry celebrates the Rebbe's fiftieth year of leadership, the movement is growing in an unprecedented manner, with hundreds of new couples going on lifelong missions to represent the Rebbe in over 100 countries and all 50 States in the U.S.A.

Greeting and Blessing:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 8 Shevat, with enclosures. Many thanks for the good news it contained about the progress of the Congregation and forthcoming events, including the fourth annual dinner set for the 26th of Shevat.

Significantly, the event is taking place immediately after Shabbos Parshas Shekolim, the theme of which is the half-shekel contribution "To make atonement for your souls" (לכור על נפשותיכם).

One of the eternal lessons of this annual contribution of the half-shekel - neither more nor less, by rich and poor alike, is that every Jew - rich and poor, scholar and layman is equally dear to HaShem - because deep in one's heart and soul every Jew is attached to HaShem, to the highest degree of Mesiras-Nefesh for His Torah and Mitzvos.

The half-shekel is certainly no measure of a Jew's devotion to HaShem. But HaShem requested a tangible expression of it in terms of money, to show how a Jew, every Jew, is capable of converting a silver coin into a matbe'a shelesh, a "fiery coin," similar to the one HaShem showed to Moshe Rabbeinu, as the Medrash explains.

My father of saintly memory, after whom your congregation is named, exemplified such real Mesiras-Nefesh for the preservation of Yiddishkeit under the most trying conditions, suffering persecution and exile, and inspiring many Jews to follow his example. Here in the U.S.A. etc. G-d gave us the possibility to practice all this without any difficulties at all and many times - even with the encouragement of the environment. Therefore, I trust and am sure each and all members and friends of Congregation Levi Yitzchok-Lubavitch will be continuously inspired, too, to help make the Congregation a model of what a Jewish congregation should be like.

May you proceed in this direction from strength to strength, in continuous growth and fruit-bearing, in keeping with the message of the New Year For Trees which we just observed.

Dr. Herbert E. Brizel has spent a lifetime of giving to others.

His career has encompassed 45 years of academic medicine and private practice in the discipline of radiation oncology, specializing in head and neck cancers. He contributed to the field through groundbreaking research publications, teaching, and creating educational programs, all of which helped develop radiation therapy from an exotic, last hope cancer treatment into an integral part of cancer treatment planning. Dr. Brizel is a Fellow of the American College of Radiology, a Distinguished Fellow of the American College of Nuclear Medicine, and a recipient of the Spirit of Healing Award from the Memorial Healthcare System, among numerous honors and recognition.

He is an active emeritus staff member of the hospitals, and continues to oversee cancer-related clinical trials there, in addition to regularly attending breast and lung tumor boards to stay current, as well as share his expertise. Dr. Brizel further serves as an active emeritus board member of the Memorial Foundation and Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital Foundation.

Herb and his beloved wife Nancy (z"I) have been philanthropic pillars of the entire Jewish community, and long-time friends of Chabad, sharing in our joyous spirit and supporting the many critical programs that positively impact our community to make it strong. Upon Nancy's passing, he and his children generously donated one of the stained glass windows in our sanctuary in her loving memory. Chabad takes great pleasure in honoring Dr. Herbert Brizel with its Lifetime Achievement Award.







Rabbi Yossi Lebovics

Rabbi Yossi Lebovics is the Principal of the Chaya Aydel Seminary, since its inception in 2002. 
